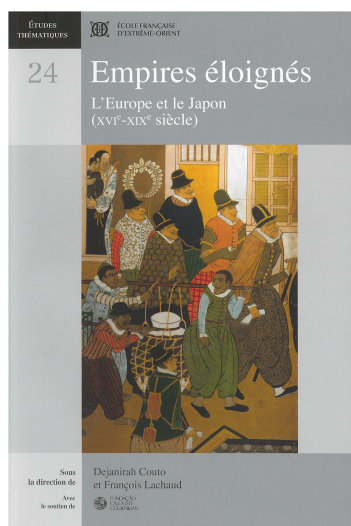


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François Lachaud is Professor of Japanese studies at the French School of Asian Studies (EFEF) since 2000. His interests include art history, Japanese Buddhism, and diplomatic and cultural exchanges in East Asia during the premodern and modern eras (17th–19th century). He is the author of *La Jeune fille et la Mort* (IHEJ, 2006), *Le Vieil Homme qui vendait du thé* (Cerf, 2010), and editor of several edited volumes: *Légitimités, légitimations : la construction de l'autorité au Japon* (EFEF, 2005); *Distant Empires: Europe and Japan (16th–19th Centuries)* (EFEF, 2010); *Jiz?, divinité japonaise* (Talmart, 2012); and *Empires on the Move: Encounters between China and the West in the Early Modern Era (16th–19th Centuries)* (EFEF 2017).
